What engagement methods have been used?</p>	<p>The draft policy was circulated to the full membership of the CRG and registered stakeholders for two weeks for their views, both to establish whether any amendments to the policy are required, and to understand from their perspective what the key questions to ask at consultation might be.</p> <p>Two responses were received from CRG-registered stakeholders. No responses were received from CRG members.</p> <p>Key response themes were as follows:</p> <p>(1) Stakeholders requested that renal denervation to be considered for commissioning through evaluation</p> <p>(2) One of the CRG-registered stakeholders, a medical device company, requested for additional articles to be considered and edits made to the evidence review</p> <p>(3) Additional stakeholders were identified to include in consultation</p>
<p>What has happened or changed as a result of their input?</p>	<p>Stakeholders were invited to comment. No changes made to the evidence review or policy proposition as the requested additional articles fall outside the inclusion criteria of the evidence review (i.e. unpublished data) or do not materially impact the outcome of the policy proposition. The PWG also reviewed the questions raised about the evidence review and concluded that the evidence review is accurate as is. Additional identified stakeholders (UK Renal Denervation Affiliation) will be invited to comment as part of public consultation.</p>
