How have the stakeholders been involved? What engagement methods have been used?	The draft policy, along with impact assessments, was circulated to the full membership of the CRG and registered stakeholders for one week for their views, both to establish whether any amendments to the policy are required, and to understand from their perspective what the key questions to ask at consultation might be. Two responses were received by CRG stakeholders, from an individual, and from the Royal College of Radiologists. The responses received confirmed the evidence as demonstrated and highlighted that this intervention would benefit the few patients eligible. The feedback highlighted the need for further collaboration amongst specialties including neurologists and radiologists to review the commissioning of radiotherapy for a range of benign conditions.
What has happened or changed as a result of their input?	The PWG has considered the feedback received and note the need to develop a review of commissioning of radiotherapy for benign conditions. The PWG will be considering a CtE application. The additional stakeholder identifies will be consulted during the 30-day public consultation period.
How are stakeholders been informed of progress with policy development as a result of their input?	An engagement report, along with the updated policy proposition will be involved as part of the public consultation. Stakeholders will be notified and invited to comment further.
