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<p>How have the stakeholders been involved? What engagement methods have been used?</p>	<p>The draft policy was circulated to the full membership of the CRG and registered stakeholders for one week for their views, both to establish whether any amendments to the policy are required, and to understand from their perspective what the key questions to ask at consultation might be.</p> <p>No comments were received from CRG-registered stakeholders. Two comments were received from CRG members.</p> <p>Key response themes were as follows: (1) It is not clear how the cut off point of 24 years was reached (2) A cut off age of 24 leaves no provision for HSCT for patients over 24 years of age, it would be helpful if the policy could reflect the needs of patients with inborn errors of metabolism over 24 years</p>
<p>What has happened or changed as a result of their input?</p>	<p>Stakeholders were invited to comment.</p> <p>No updates were made to the policy proposition. HSCT for inborn errors for patients over 24 years of age falls outside the scope of this policy development process which aims to provide a position on childhood diseases that may extend into early adulthood. The cut off of 24 years was based on NICE guidance on treatment for young people, which defines the group to 24 years of age. Patients with these indications outside this age range would be very rare.</p> <p>No updates were made to the evidence review.</p>
<p>How are stakeholders been informed of progress with policy development as a result of their input?</p>	<p>This engagement report, along with the updated policy proposition will be circulated as part of the public consultation. Stakeholders will be notified and invited to comment further.</p>
<p>What level of wider public consultation is recommended by the CRG for the NPOC Board to agree as a result of stakeholder involvement?</p>	<p>Public consultation for a period of 30 days as supported by stakeholders.</p>
