How have stakeholders been involved? What engagement methods have been used?	Policy proposition been out to stakeholder testing, and active encouragement of key stakeholder groups to respond (CHIVA, Patient groups etc.). CRG kept briefed of progress and stakeholder testing to alert their networks. PPV reps on the CRG actively reviewing registered stakeholder list to ensure all patient groups represented.
What has happened or changed as a result of their input?	Wording around PENTA and paediatric pathway amended. Awaiting response from CHIVA re wording.
How are stakeholders being kept informed of progress with policy development as a result of their input?	Regular updates at the CRG and key stakeholder messages.
What level of wider public consultation is recommended by the CRG for the NPOC Board to agree as a result of stakeholder involvement?	One month is recommended given this policy is bringing in the NHS policy in line with professional guidance. Some responses to stakeholder testing recommended that no further consultation was required, but given that some respondents felt that a 12 week consultation was required, one month is the recommended consultation period.
