The proposed criteria for commissioning have been modified to include the term “designated Children’s Epilepsy Surgery Service” in the bullet which discusses previous consideration for surgical resection.
<b>How are stakeholders being kept informed of progress with policy development as a result of their input?</b>	Stakeholders will be kept informed of the policy’s progress through NHS England’s consultation portal website.
