We appreciate that this may be a very difficult time but we would like to invite you to take part in the VOICES survey of experiences of care in the last months of life. The results will be used to improve care and services for people and their families at the end of life. NHS England is funding this survey which the Office for National Statistics (ONS) is undertaking on their behalf. ONS will not release your personal details to anyone. Your responses to the survey will be shared with NHS England and their approved researchers using only your Study ID Number to ensure that total confidentiality is maintained.

Taking part in the VOICES survey involves completing a questionnaire which asks about experiences in the last months of life, care received from health and social services and whether care needs were fully met.
