How have stakeholders been involved? What engagement methods have been used?	Stakeholders have been involved in the policy working group. The draft policy proposition was distributed to stakeholders via email for a period of 2 weeks of stakeholder testing between 24 <sup>th</sup> January to 10 <sup>th</sup> February 2020. Stakeholders were asked to submit their responses via email, using a standard response and in line with NHS England's standard processes for developing clinical policies.
What has happened or changed as a result of their input?	All respondents supported the draft policy position. Minor changes and clarifications have been made to the policy.
How are stakeholders being kept informed of progress with policy development as a result of their input?	All stakeholders (including CRG members and registered stakeholders) will be notified when the draft policy proposition goes out to public consultation and will be kept informed of the policy's progress through NHS England's consultation process and portal website.
